“Ordinary Magic: Understanding and Promoting Resilience in Child Development”

A workshop for how to help children overcome challenges

Dr. Masten will highlight findings from decades of developmental research on resilience that illuminate how children cope successfully with challenges. She will identify key supports needed in the lives of children, including the mind and body, relationships, and their schools, communities and cultures.

Dr. Masten will further discuss how the “ordinary magic” of resilience is nurtured, and present practical examples for taking action.

Dr. **Ann S. Masten**, Ph.D., LP, is a Professor of Child Development at the University of Minnesota, Twin Cities. In 2014, Dr. Masten published her book, *Ordinary Magic: Resilience in Development*, from her studies of resilience in human development, particularly in the context of poverty, homelessness, war, disaster, and migration.

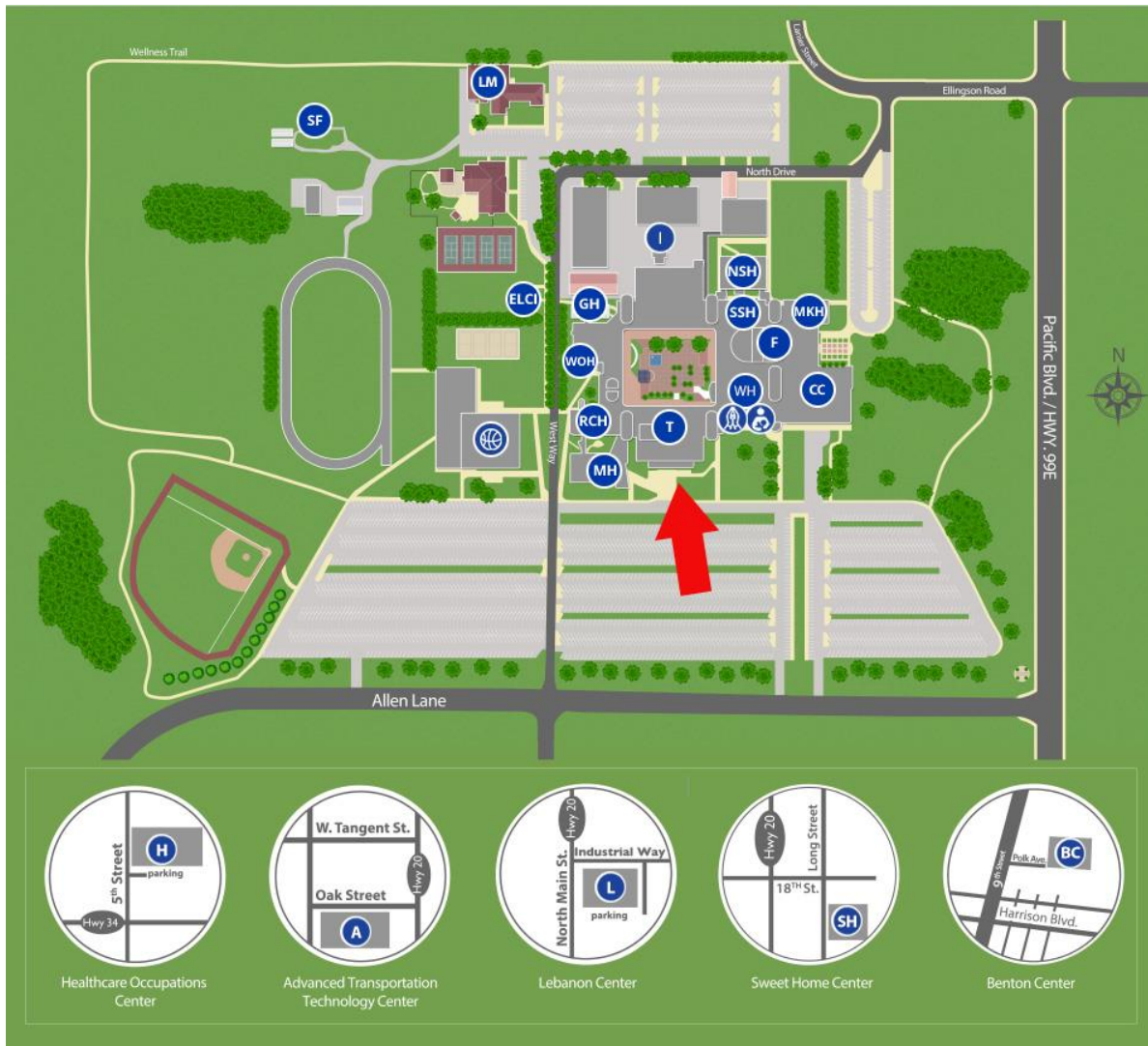
